The seven days of creation

DAY.	The irradiance of Life; light, the spiritual idea of Truth and Love. "And the evening and the morning were the first day." (Genesis i. 5.) The objects of time and sense disappear in the illumination of spiritual understanding, and Mind measures time according to the good that is unfolded. This unfolding is God's day, and "there shall be no night there."
EVENING.	Mistiness of mortal thought; weariness of mortal mind; obscured views; peace and rest.
MORNING.	Light; symbol of Truth; revelation and progress.
NIGHT.	Darkness; doubt; fear.
FIRMAMENT.	Spiritual understanding; the scientific line of demarcation between Truth and error, between Spirit and so-called matter.
EARTH.	A sphere; a type of eternity and immortality, which are likewise without beginning or end. To material sense, earth is matter; to spiritual sense, it is a compound idea.

1st Thousand-year Period of Bible history

ADAM.	(For first paragraph of definition, see "Glossary" - last paragraph reads:-) The name Adam represents the false supposition that Life is not eternal, but has beginning and end; that the infinite enters the finite, that intelligence passes into non-intelligence, and that Soul dwells in material sense; that immortal Mind results in matter, and matter in mortal mind; that the one God and creator entered what He created, and then disappeared in the atheism of matter.
DUST.	Nothingness; the absence of substance, life, or intelligence.
EVE.	A beginning; mortality; that which does not last forever; a finite belief concerning life, substance, and intelligence in matter; error; the belief that the human race originated materially instead of spiritually, - that man started first from dust, second from a rib, and third from an egg.
SERPENT.	(<u>ophis</u> , in Greek; <u>nacash</u> , in Hebrew). Subtlety; a lie; the opposite of Truth, named error; the first statement of mythology and idolatry; the belief in more than one God; animal magnetism; the first lie of limitation; finity; the first claim that there is an opposite of Spirit, or good, termed matter, or evil; the first delusion that error exists as fact; the first claim that sin, sickness, and death are the realities of life. The first audible claim that God was not omnipotent and that there was another power, named <u>evil</u> , which was as real and eternal as God, good.
ABEL.	Watchfulness; self-offering; surrendering to the creator the early fruits of experience.

MOSES' SEVEN ASCENTS UP MOUNT SINAI

(Exodus 19:3 - 40:38)

<u>MIND</u> (19:3-8a)	<u>1st Ascent</u> - <u>"Let there be light..."</u> God says how He brought the children of Israel out of Egypt and bare them on eagle's wings. Mind's idea is power and infinitely available to alert, receptive thought.
<u>SPIRIT</u> (19:8b-15)	<u>2nd Ascent</u> - <u>"Let there be a firmament..."</u> God tells Moses to get the children of Israel to sanctify themselves, wash their clothes, and be ready against the third day. Spirit's nature is pure and impels cultured spiritual understanding
<u>SOUL</u> (19:16-25)	<u>3rd Ascent</u> - <u>"... let the dry land appear..."</u> There is smoke and fire and lightning on Mount Sinai. No one is allowed to touch the Mount except Moses and Aaron. Soul's immaculate spiritual facts make demands on men which can only be met through spiritual progress and spiritual education.
<u>PRINCIPLE</u> (20:1-23:33)	<u>4th Ascent</u> - <u>"Let there be lights..."</u> The Commandments and the Judgments are given, corresponding to the Word, the Christ and Christianity. Principle interprets itself through revelation, reason and demonstration.
<u>LIFE</u> (24:1-11)	<u>5th Ascent</u> - <u>"Let the waters bring forth abundantly ... fowl that may fly ... in the open firmament of heaven</u> <u>..."</u> The priests and 70 of the elders go up the Mount with Moses. He builds an altar under the hill with 12 pillars and they see "the body of heaven in his cleanness." They also see God and "did eat and drink." Life lifts us to the point where we can demonstrate Principle in a living way and from a higher standpoint. And we see the coincidence of the divine with the human.
<u>TRUTH</u> (24:12-33:23)	<u>6th Ascent</u> - <u>"Let us make man in our image, after our likeness; and let them have dominion..."</u> Moses is given the instructions for building the tabernacle; also the garments for the priests and the duties of the priests. Then he comes down from the Mount, breaks up the tables, and destroys the golden calf which the Israelites had begun to worship. Truth shows us the ideal form, the structure and flow of spiritual being in all its detail - the actual "body of heaven in his cleanness" - man. Then Truth shows us how to analyze, uncover and annihilate error.
<u>LOVE</u> (34:1-40:38)	<u>7th Ascent</u> - <u>"... and He (God) rested on the seventh day..."</u> Moses receives a new vision of Love, is told to hew out the tables for himself and the tabernacle is built. Its building is fourfold: 1) materials willingly brought - the Word 2) everything moulded and formed - the Christ 3) instructions given as to how all the parts shall be placed in relationship to each other - Christianity 4) the tabernacle is erected - Science. Love shows us how to love God and man so that we can translate the infinite ideal to every state of thought and thus establish the tabernacle "whose builder and maker is God." (Heb.11:10)

THE STORY OF ABRAHAM

IN ITS SEVEN FOLD DEVELOPMENT

(Genesis 12:1 - 25:8)

MIND	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - (12:1-20) <u>Let there be light</u> - Abram impelled to come out of his country to a land that God would show him - God says, "I will make of thee a great nation" - In Egypt, Abram calls his wife, Sarai, his sister - (with Pharaoh)
SPIRIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - (13:1-18) <u>Let there be a firmament</u> - Abram parts from Lot and is then shown the land he is to inherit
SOUL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - (14:1 - 17:27) <u>Let the dry land appear</u> - Warfare between four kings and five kings in which Lot is engulfed and Abram rescues him and on returning meets Melchizedek - Abram promised a seed out of his own bowels and God makes a covenant with him that his seed will possess the land - Abram, childless, takes a bondmaid, Hagar, who brings forth Ishmael - Covenant with Abram renewed and Abram's name changed to Abraham and Sarai's name changed to Sarah - Circumcision to be the token of the covenant
PRINCIPLE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - (18:1-33) <u>Let there be lights to rule over the day and over the night</u> - Abraham sees three men at his tent door and promise of a son renewed - Abraham pleads for the righteous in the impending destruction of Sodom
LIFE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - (19:1 - 21:8) <u>Let the waters bring forth abundantly and fowl fly in the open firmament of heaven</u> - Sodom is destroyed and Lot escapes to a little city, Zoar, and then to a cave where he brings forth children from his own daughters - Abraham again calls his wife his sister - (with Abimelech) - Sarah brings forth Isaac
TRUTH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - (21:9-34) <u>Let us make man in our image with dominion over all the earth</u> - The son of the bondwoman cast out but taken care of - Covenant with Abimelech
LOVE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - (22:1 - 25:8) <u>And God rested</u> - Abraham attempts to sacrifice Isaac, but instead God provides a ram caught in the thicket by his two horns - Sarah dies and Abraham purchases a burying place for her - Abraham sends his servant back to his land to obtain a bride for Isaac (Rebekah) - Abraham weds Keturah - Abraham dies
