- *rent or lend it to the public*
- *perform or show it in public*
- *communicate it to the public*

As mentioned above, for infringement to take place it must involve a substantial part of the work. Whether or not the part to be reproduced is substantial is subjective and the quality, importance or significance of the extract are equally as important (some may say more so) as the quantity of words or lines - using just four lines of a poem or even a four word extract have been found to be substantial."

The UK Copyright Service (www.copyrightservice.co.uk) expresses this positively by defining the term of "fair dealing":

"Fair dealing is a term used to describe some limited activities that are allowed without infringing copyright. Briefly these are as follows:

Research and private study

Copying parts of a literary, dramatic, musical or artistic work or of a typographical arrangement of a published edition for the purpose of research or private study is allowed under the following conditions:

- *The copy is made for the purposes of research or private study.*
- *The copy is made for non-commercial purposes.*
- *The source of the material is acknowledged.*
- *The person making the copy does not make copies of the material available for a number of people."*

This means positively within the terms of our Copyright Notice that copies or printouts of this CD / these CDs / these audio files or any other copyrighted material may be made for archival/backup purposes, for research or private study but if you wish to use extra copies for others and/or make files available to others (e.g. in classes, talks or seminars, private study groups, gatherings in general) you really should always be fair and contact The John W.
